Sikkim power project to be inaugurated in September

Kolkata, June 20

Gati Infrastructure Ltd (GIL) has said that the 110-MW Chuzachen Hydro Project in East Sikkim district would be formally inaugurated in September. In a note, it said that the project on the twin rivers – Rangpo and Rongli – had already been commissioned and begun evacuating power through a 24-km transmission line linked to the national grid. The independent power project is on a build, operate, own and transfer mode. Mahendra Agarwal, CEO of Gati Ltd, a listed courier and supply chain solution outfit, is the promoter of GIL. — **Our Bureau**

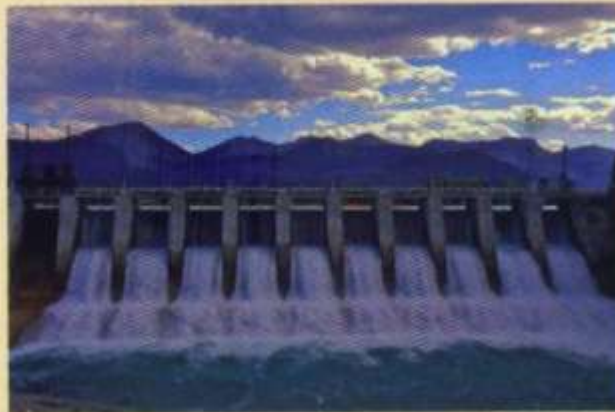

Gati Infrastructure commissions 110 MW Hydro Electric Power Project in Sikkim

Gati Infrastructure Limited (GIL), a subsidiary of Amrit Jal Ventures Ltd (AJVL) promoted by Mr. Mahendra Agarwal, Founder and CEO of Gati Ltd. commissioned its first 110 MW Hydro Electric Power Plant in Sikkim.

Gati Infrastructure had entered into an Agreement with the State Government of Sikkim to implement three Hydro Power Projects on a Build, Operate, Own and Transfer basis (BOOT). The first project – 110MW Chuzachen Hydro Project on Rangpo and Rongli rivers has been commissioned and started producing and selling power. This is the first IPP (independent power project) in hydroelectric power sector in the state of Sikkim



and the seven sisters of North East. The plant is directly connected to the Central Transmission Utility (National Grid) through a 24 Km dedicated transmission line and will be able to deliver power across the country.

Gati Limited – pioneer and leader in Express Distribution and Supply Chain Solutions and TCI Finance Limited are shareholders of the company. Amrit Jal Ventures Ltd is implementing two more Hydro Electric Power Projects in the state

of Sikkim, 54 MW Bhasmey Hydro Electric Project (under construction) and 71 MW Sada Mangder Project.

99 MW Chujachen HEP ready for October commissioning

GANGTOK, June 19: The Gati Infrastructure Project Director Meera Madhusudhan Singh today said that the 99

Megawatt Chujachen Hydro Electric Project on Rangpo and Rongli rivees in East Sikkim is likely to get officially commissioned in October.

Speaking on the sidelines

of the plantation drive organized by the company at Bering, Singh said. "Though the work of power generation has already started from the month of April, the official commissioning would be done by Chief Minister Pawan Chumling in October. We are just waiting for the monsoon to get over," she said.

The State government will get 14 percent royalty from the total power generation. The project started in 2006 and presently 142 local persons are employed there.

"This is the first IPP (independent power project) in hydroelectric power sector in Sikkim and the seven sisters

Launch drive to plant one lakh saplings

GANGTOK, 19 June: CEO, Gati Infrastructure Pvt. Ltd., Mahendra Agarwal, informed today that the 99 MW Rangpo Chuhydel project being developed by the company at Chujachen in East Sikkim will be formally commissioned in October later this year. Mr. Agarwal announced this during a plantation drive held at the project site today.
